#### **APPS & LINKS**



Lectio 365 – this free app is a daily devotional resource to help you pray through the Bible every day. The people who have written and present the material are an international, interdenominational Christian movement of prayer, mission and justice. There are morning prayers and night prayer. Morning prayers are devotionals written for every day of the year. The latter helps you process your day with God and prepare to sleep by reflecting, rejoicing, repenting and resting. Lectio 365 can be audio or you can read it for yourself. Approx. 10 mins.



**Open Prayer book** this free app allows you to download various options for connecting with God. Our NZ prayer book is there and you can pull up what you want to look at, the Sacred Space has a nice mix of devotion and reflection alongside the scripture, you can customize it to suit your taste and style of worship and prayer.



**Tuia** a free app. New Zealand Anglican creation. Daily devotions.

**Word for Today** a free app. It can be audio so you can simply listen or read it for yourself. These are usually 2-3 mins long.



**Our Daily Bread** – a free app can be audio or you can read the text. It provides the Bible reading, offers a short reflection and asks some questions to help you engage with what you have heard. The audio is around 4 minutes long. There are also evening meditations available.
